## *A Little Bit of History*

Twenty-eight ladies of Point Loma (then Roseville) assembled at the home of Mrs. F. S. Jennings, Monday, 11/6/1911, at 3 p.m. to discuss the organization of a local improvement Society. Their goal was to aid in the growth and improvement of Point Loma. After discussion, it was determined it would be called **Point Loma Assembly**.

Dues were \$3 per year, and there was a 25-cent admission fee. There would be Parliamentary rules, and parliamentary drills and they would draw up a constitution. Three committees were formed, Educational, Social & Charitable.

In April of 1913, the group decided to incorporate, and started plans for a clubhouse to be built. Mr. Jennings offered to let them "lease" the lot for 30 years, at a penny a year. The Point Loma Assembly would pay the taxes and assessments and raise the money to build a clubhouse. It took three years of fundraising to raise the money and the clubhouse was built, with Jennings paying 10% of the building cost.

The first meeting of the Point Loma Assembly, in the new clubhouse, was held on 9/21/1914, with the formal dedication taking place on 1/4/1915.

For such a small group, they would prove to be quite powerful.

In 1912, the women of Point Loma Assembly wrote to the Women's Christian Temperance Union wanting a resolution to refuse all concessions for the sale of alcohol for the California Exposition in Balboa Park. This was unanimously adopted.

Also in 1912, the women of Point Loma Assembly wrote the postmaster and the Sunset Telephone Company, asking to change the name of Roseville to Point Loma. This was approved. Later they wrote to the newspaper, and the Spreckels Company asking them to erect a shelter at the Roseville Station (it is unclear if this was a horse drawn carriage station.) When told the shelter would cost \$60,000, the women asked for another report

## Recipe of the Month

### Lemon Vinaigrette

- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 3 T fresh lemon juice
- 1 T minced shallot
- 1/2 T Dijon mustard
- 1/2 t grated lemon peel
- 1/2 t sugar
- 1 t fresh thyme leaves

Whisk all ingredients to blend. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Store in refrigerator. Bring to room temperature before serving.

Says Pat, "We enjoy this dressing on a salad of mixed spring greens, cold asparagus, sun dried tomatoes, toasted pistachios, and shaved Parmesan cheese."
